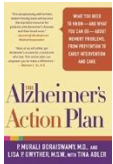
Duke Memory Disorders Clinic

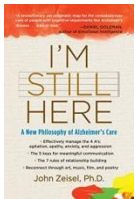

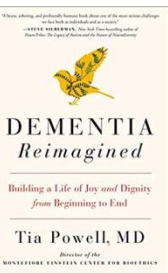
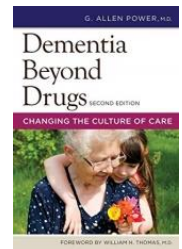
